



Conduct Policy

Behavior

- Respect toward our teachers, fellow classmates, and other classrooms is a vital part of demonstrating dignity for life and will be expected from every student at all times during religious education classes, programs, speaker sessions, and field trips.
- If a student is disrespectful by being disruptive, throwing things, acting inappropriately, or distracting the class in any way that interrupts it from its goal of teaching and learning about the Catholic faith, the student will be subject to consequences in the Three Crows Method based on St. Peter's denial of Christ in the Bible.
- Any behavior issues will be dealt with in the Three Crows Method:
 1. **Crow One:** Parent contacted. Student will pray with the Director of Religious Education and/or parent during or after class.
 2. **Crow Two:** Parent contacted. Student will pray with Director of Religious Education during class, stay 10 minutes after class to help clean up, and write a letter to God required by the next class and submitted to the Director.
 3. **Crow Three:** Parent contacted. Dismissal without refund may result.

Note: If a student is engaging in behavior that is dangerous or illegal, or puts others' safety at risk, parents will be contacted immediately, along with the police.

Electronic Device Usage (Cell phones, Smartphones, iPhones, iPods, etc.)

- One of our actions to show faithfulness and love for God is to take time for Him. One of the fruits of the Holy Spirit is self-control.
- Therefore, **any electronic devices that are used during class for personal use will be confiscated by the teacher** and given to the Director of Religious Education.
 1. **First Violation:** Student may pick up their electronic device from the Director of Religious Education after class.
 2. **Second Violation:** Parent contacted. Parent must arrange a time to pick up the electronic device from the Director of Religious Education.
 3. **Third Violation:** Parent contacted. Dismissal without refund may occur.

Attendance

- To properly prepare for sacraments and have a good understanding of the Catholic faith, we ask that students attend class regularly and have less than three absences annually.
